Divergent Earrings

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Supplies

6 2-Hole Crescent beads6 2-Hole Ginko beads

6 4mm Fire Polish or round beads

1 gram 11° seed beads 1 gram TOHO® 11° Demi's 1 pair Kidney ear wires 4 yards TOHO® One G thread

Optional supplies: Oval Jump rings and Wire Guards – Silver-plated

Equipment

Needle Nose PliersSize 11 bead needle

Thread Wax (optional, but highly recommended)

Scissors Ruler

Important notes:

- Pay close attention to the pictures for the correct orientation of the beads.
- BEFORE you start, make sure all the holes are open in the multi-holed beads.
- This pattern was written in reference to the actual pictures of the beadwork in each Figure. If you hold the beadwork differently, the directional reference to the bead holes and/or thread path will not be correct.

Preparing the thread

Cut a 2-yard length of TOHO® One G thread. Insert the thread into the needle and pull the thread until there is equal lengths on both sides. Condition the thread with wax until the doubled thread is waxed together.

Step 1. Stringing the beads from the left to right side, string (1) each of the following sequence; Crescent (concave side of the bead facing outwards or towards you), Demi, 11° SB, FP, 11° SB and Demi. Figure A

Repeat 2 more times. Figure B

Step 2. Form a circle and sew through all the beads once. Figure C

NOTE: Make sure the concave side of the Crescent beads are facing the same way and towards the outside or upwards as in Figures C & D.

Tie a couple of overhand knots with the tail and working threads.

With the working thread, sew threw the first sequence of beads. Continue to sew through the top hole of the next Crescent. Figure D Pull the thread taut, making sure the knots are secure. Trim the tail thread.

Step 3. To step-up for the next round, sewing from the right to left side, sew through the open hole of the same Crescent. Figure E

Step 4. With the beadwork lying flat on your work surface, thread a Ginko bead through the right-side hole.


NOTE: Make sure the rounded sided of the Ginko bead is facing towards you. Figure F

Continue to thread (2) 11° SB, a Wire Guard, from the right-side hole through the left-side hole and (2) 11° SB. Figure F

NOTE: Make sure the thread is lying in the channel of the Wire Guard. Figure F

Divergent Earrings/Beaded Bead

Continue to sew through the left-side hole of the Ginko. Figure F



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Step 5. Sewing towards the left, sew through the open hole of the next Crescent. Figure G Pull the thread taut.

Figure G1 shows the underside of the beaded bead. In this picture, you'll notice how the Crescent beads are snug against the Ginko bead.


Step 6. Thread (1) Ginko bead through the right-side hole. Figure H

NOTE: Make sure the rounded sided of the Ginko bead is facing outwards.

Thread (2) 11° SB, (1) Demi and (2) 11° SB and sew through the left-side hole of the Ginko. Figure H

Sewing towards the left, sew through the open hole of the next Crescent. Figure H1

Pull the thread taut.



If you DO NOT want to add a center bead, secure and end the thread. Skip to Step 11 to attach the ear wire.

To add a center bead, continue to the next step.



Optional:

Note: This step is shown using the backside of the beaded bead for better clarity.

Step 8. To add a bead to the center, continue sewing through the Wire Guard, (2) 11° SB and left-side hole of the Ginko. Insert the needle through the center and flip the beadwork over to the top side. Figure J and J1

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Step 9. Thread a center bead. For this example, I used a 5 x 5mm flower cap bead. Continue to thread an 11° SB. Figure K

Skip the 11° SB and sew down through the flower cap and through the backside of the beaded bead.

Step 10. Sew through a Ginko bead. Figure L Pull the thread taut.

Secure and end the thread.

Step 11. Using the Needle Nose Plier/s, open the loop on the kidney ear wire and attach it to the Wire Guard.

Close the loop. Figure M
