The Corset Beaded Bead

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Supplies

10 GemDuos (GD)

10 CzechMate 3-Hole Beams 10 2mm Fire Polish (F.P.)

1 gram 11° Demi

1 gram 11° seed beads (S.B.) 1-yard TOHO One-G Thread

Equipment

Thread Wax

Scissors

Thread Zapper

Ruler

#11 bead needle

Important notes:

- Pay close attention to the pictures for the correct orientation of the beads.
- This pattern was written in reference to the actual pictures of the beadwork in each Figure. If you hold the beadwork differently, the directional reference to the bead holes and/or thread path will not be correct.
- BEFORE you start make sure <u>all</u> the holes are open in the multi-holed beads.
- There are two different sides on the GemDuo (GD) beads; a flat side and a raised side. (Shown below)



For this Corset Beaded Bead, make sure the raised side is facing towards you or the outside of the bead.

Step 1. Cut a 1-yard length of thread. Use the thread wax to condition the thread (optional but highly suggested). Leaving a six-inch tail thread, string (1) of each; 11° Demi and GD through the top hole.

Repeat 4x for a total of *five* GD. Figure A

Form a circle and sew through all the beads once. Continue to sew past the tail thread, exiting a GD. Figure A1

Secure and end the tail thread.

Step 2. To step-up for the next round, sew through the bottom hole of the same GD the thread is exiting from. Figure B

The thread should now be exiting the left side of the GD. Figure B

Step 3. String (1) of each; 11° Demi, Beam (top hole) and 11° Demi. Sewing towards the left, sew through the next GD. Figure C

Repeat around the circle. Pull the thread taut. Figure C1

NOTE: As you pull the thread taut, the GemDuo's should 'cup' upwards. Figure C1

Sew through all the beads to strengthen the thread path. End with the thread exiting the top hole of the Beam. Figure C1



Step 4. To step-up for the next round, sew through the middle hole of the same Beam the thread is exiting from. Figure D

The thread should now be exiting the right side of the Beam. Figure D

Step 5. String (1) of each; 11° Demi, F.P. and 11° Demi. Sew through the middle hole of the next Beam. Figure E

Repeat around the circle. Pull the thread taut. Figure E1

NOTE: As you pull the thread taut, the Beams should fold downwards. Figure E1

Sew through all the beads, pulling the thread taut, to strengthen thread path and pull the beads together.

End with the thread exiting the middle hole of the Beam. Figure E1

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Step 6. To step-up for the next round, sew through the bottom hole of the same Beam the thread is exiting from. Figure F

The thread should now be exiting the left side of the Beam. Figure F


Step 7. String (1) Beam through the top hole. Sew through the bottom hole of the next Beam. Figure G

Repeat around the circle. Pull the thread taut.

Sew through all the beads, pulling the thread taut, to strengthen the thread path and pull the beads together.

NOTE: The thread will be showing a little in between the Beams. This will be remedied in the next step.

End with the thread exiting the top hole of the Beam added in this step. Figure G1



Repeat around the circle. Pull the thread taut. Figure H1

End with the thread exiting the top hole of a Beam from Step 7. Figure H1





Step 9. To step-up for the next round, sew through the middle hole of the same Beam the thread is exiting from. Figure I

The thread should now be exiting the right side of the Beam. Figure I

Step 10. Repeat Step 5 to add a row of Demi's with F.P. Figure J End with the thread exiting the middle hole of the Beam. Figure J

To step-up for the next round, sew through the bottom hole of the same Beam the thread is exiting from. The thread should now be exiting towards the left. Figure J





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Step 11. String (1) of each; 11° Demi, GD (top hole) and 11° Demi

Sew through the bottom hole of the next Beam. Figure K


Repeat around the circle. Pull the thread taut. Figure K1

Sew through all the beads, pulling the thread taut, to strengthen the thread path and pull the beads together.

End with the thread exiting the top hole of a GD. Figure K1

Step 12. To step-up for the next round, sew through the bottom (open) hole of the same GD the thread is exiting from. Figure L

The thread should now be exiting towards the right. Figure L



Repeat around the circle. Pull the thread taut. Figure M1

Sew through all the beads, 'cupping' your fingers around the GD's, to push them together.

Pull the thread taut, to strengthen the thread path and close the beaded bead. Figure M1
Secure and end the thread.




